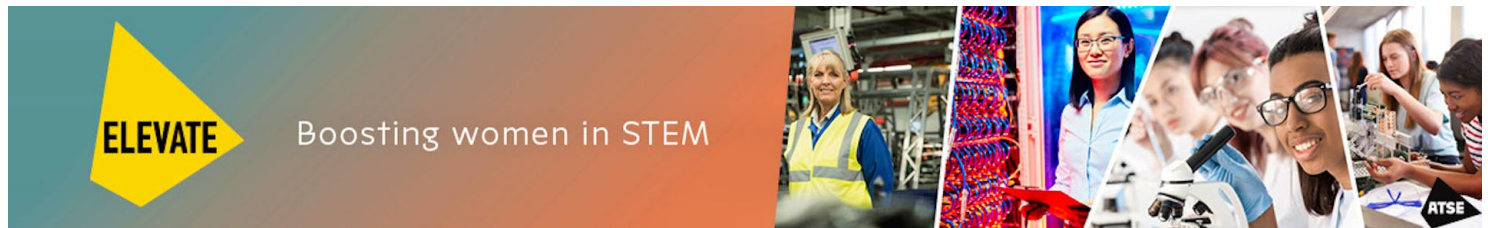

Leadership Scholarship 2025

Up to \$70,000 for a maximum of two years. Applicants who have a STEM qualification and are looking to commence a degree to improve business acumen OR applicants looking to commence a Master by Coursework in an eligible STEM field should select this category. Applicants who demonstrate leadership capability will be prioritised in this category.

Applications are currently open for the [Elevate: Boosting women in STEM Program 2025](#) ("Elevate").

Elevate will award up to 500 undergraduate and postgraduate scholarships to women and non-binary people in STEM. The Elevate Program provides:

- A scholarship
- Access to events and networking
- Mentoring
- Ongoing support during scholars' university studies

Before completing an application for the Elevate: Boosting in women in STEM Program, please ensure that you have reviewed the [Elevate Application Guidelines](#). It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure they are eligible to apply for the program. All application questions must be answered unless (optional) appears next to the question.

The confidentiality of applicants is of paramount importance. The information included in eligible applications will be used to assess applicants for Elevate scholarships, but personal information including the name, descriptions of gender identity and address of the applicant will not be provided to the assessors. The information linked to the applicant's name will only be accessed by ATSE.

Applications for the 2025 Elevate program close at 5:00pm (AEST Canberra/Sydney/Melbourne) 30 August 2024.

ATSE will not respond to enquiries submitted after 5:00pm (AEST Canberra/Sydney/Melbourne) on 29 August 2024. We recommend anyone seeking guidance or advice for their applications submit their questions in advance of the deadline.

Alternative modes of submission

ATSE is committed to providing inclusive and equitable access to all potential applicants. If for any reason you are unable to submit written responses to the questions in this application form, ATSE will also accept alternative modes of submission. Applicants may prefer to create a video, either of themselves or from images or drawings that they compile. Applicants may also submit applications verbally via an interview with a member of the Elevate team. Applicants must still convey responses to questions as per the application form, as assessors are still required to score applications against a set of three key selection criteria.

Eligibility requirements for the Elevate: Boosting Women in STEM scholarships can be found in the [Elevate Application guidelines](#).

Applicants are required to meet all three eligibility criteria to proceed to the application form:

- Identify as a woman or non-binary person
- Be enrolling as a domestic student at an Australian University
- Be planning to undertake a STEM degree or higher studies to improve business acumen, commencing in 2025.

The scholarships are available to those who plan to commence study in 2025. Those who are currently studying are ineligible to apply for their current degree, however we would be delighted to receive your application in the future if you chose to undertake postgraduate research studies or further study to elevate your leadership skills.

The purpose of this grant, provided by the Department of Industry, Science and Resources (DISR) is to support individuals who identify as a woman or non-binary person in STEM. It is required that all applicants identify either as a woman or as non-binary to be eligible for the Elevate program.

While the term non-binary is regularly used to include all people who do not identify as a man or woman, Elevate acknowledges that this term may not describe your own gender identity, and therefore, you are welcome to nominate a different term. Please note that this information will not be shared with anyone outside ATSE, including assessors. Your answer to this question will only be used by ATSE to determine your eligibility for the program.

To be eligible for the Elevate Program, all students must be able to enrol as a Domestic Student at their university. Please check the requirements of the university you are applying to and determine if you are eligible to enrol as a domestic student. Generally, domestic students are either an Australian Citizen, a New Zealand Citizen or a person entitled to enter and stay in Australia without any limitation of time (such as Australian permanent resident and Australian permanent humanitarian visa holder).

We encourage women and non-binary people who are more than 5 years post-graduation, who have experience either within or outside the STEM sector, to apply for leadership scholarships.

The industry priority areas of national importance, targeted through the [National Reconstruction Fund](#), are renewables and low emissions technology; medical science; transport, value-add in the agriculture, forestry, and fisheries sectors; value-add in resources; defence capability and enabling capabilities.

Disciplines identified by consultation include the following areas which will be taken into consideration on application: Natural Sciences (Agriculture, Environmental Sciences, Climate Sustainability and Adaptation, Geology and Entomology) and Engineering (Material engineering, chemical engineering, minerals, energy, transport, and circular economy).

Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander: Refers to the Indigenous peoples of Australia, including Aboriginal Australians and Torres Strait Islanders, who have distinct cultural and historical backgrounds.

Belonging to the LGBTQIA+ community: Describes individuals who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual, or other non-heteronormative identities.

First in family to attend university: Indicates individuals who are the first in their immediate family to pursue higher education at a university level.

From a culturally and racially marginalised (CARM): Refers to individuals or groups who experience social, economic, and political disadvantages or exclusion due to their cultural or racial identities. This marginalisation can manifest in various forms, such as limited access to resources, opportunities, rights, and representation in mainstream institutions. It often results from systemic discrimination, bias, prejudice, and historical inequalities based on cultural or racial differences. Marginalised communities may face barriers to full participation and inclusion in society, leading to disparities in areas such as education, employment, healthcare, and justice.

From culturally and/or linguistically diverse background (CALD): Refers to people from a range of countries and ethnic and cultural groups. It includes people of non-English speaking background as well as people born outside Australia but whose first language is English, and encompasses a wide range of experiences and needs.

From a low socio-economic background: Refers to individuals or families with limited financial resources and access to economic opportunities, often facing challenges related to income, education, and employment.

From a regional, rural or remote area: Describes individuals who currently live, or have lived for a large majority of their life, in areas outside major urban centres, typically characterised by smaller populations and different access to services and resources.

Have caring responsibilities (e.g. children, special needs, disability, medical, aged care): Indicates individuals who have responsibilities for the care and support of dependents, which can include children, family members with special needs, or individuals with disabilities.

Living with disability: Describes individuals who have a physical, cognitive, sensory, or mental health impairment that may impact their daily activities and participation in various aspects of life.

Neurodiverse: Refers to individuals who have neurological differences, such as autism, ADHD, dyslexia, or other neurodevelopmental conditions, highlighting the diversity of brain functioning and cognitive styles.

Person of Colour: Refers to individuals who do not consider themselves as white or of anglo-European Ancestry. It encompasses all non-white groups and can emphasise the common experiences of systemic racism.

Recent or first-generation migrant to Australia including refugees: Indicates individuals who have migrated to Australia, either as recent immigrants or as first-generation migrants, including refugees who have sought asylum due to persecution or conflict in their home countries.

Returning to education and/or work after a significant period away: Describes individuals who are re-entering educational or employment settings after a prolonged absence, which could be due to various reasons such as caregiving, health issues, or other life circumstances.

Prefer not to say: Indicates a preference by individuals to withhold specific personal information or identifiers for reasons of privacy or personal choice.

The Elevate: Boosting Women in STEM program will offer:

Skills-building workshops and networking events: The Elevate program offers a variety of professional development workshops and networking events facilitated by both ATSE and our Elevate partner organisations.

Mentoring: The mentoring component of the Elevate program is a chance for scholars to enhance their skills and knowledge, extending beyond the technical expertise acquired through their degree. Mentoring is an opportunity to receive advice and constructive feedback, share experiences, and foster an environment where they can amplify confidence in their abilities and skills.

Wellbeing support: ATSE use an external provider for counselling and supporting mental health wellbeing, acknowledging that trained professionals in mental health and wellbeing will provide the best support for scholars.
